Dear Ms. Alvarez Avila:

You have asked us to provide you with our observations on Mr. Hugo Pérezcano's letter on behalf of Mexico to Mr. Roberto Daffino, the Secretary General of ICSID, dated March 4, 2005. We are happy to provide you with those observations, which generally fall into two categories. First, the letter involves a number of issues that Mexico has raised and that we have already addressed on several occasions. Second, the other category involves matters that we believe go to the merits of our claims and should be resolved by the arbitration panel. Although we have addressed many of these issues before, we would be happy to do so again if it would help facilitate your review and ultimate registration of these claims for arbitration that we submitted to you on January 19, 2005.¹

1. Issues That Mexico Has Already Raised and To Which We Have Already Responded

- Mexico contends that Claimants have not complied with Article 1119 of NAFTA. Mexico states that:

Article 1119 of NAFTA sets out the obligation of each investor/claimant to present, individually, a notice of intent to submit a claim to arbitration, which must be observed before a claim may be submitted in conformity with Section B of Chapter XI. On October 7, 2003, the Free Trade Commission of NAFTA (FTC) issued a Statement on the

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Notice of Intent to Submit to Arbitration, which specifies which documents must be attached and has a format that facilitates compliance with the Article in question.

Letter from Mexico, ¶ 21 (March 4, 2005). Mexico's claim is based on an excerpt of the Free Trade Commission's Statement, taken out of context. The Free Trade Commission's Statement itself makes plain that this form is one possible way to satisfy the requirements of Article 1119, and is neither the exclusive nor the required means of satisfying that Article:

The Free Trade Commission has determined that the attached form for notices of intent to submit a claim to arbitration, if properly completed, will satisfy the requirements of Article 1119 of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and help clarify the basis of a claim, and recommends that disputing investors use it.

Statement of the Free Trade Commission on Notices of Intent to Submit a Claim to Arbitration, § A, available at <http://www.state.gov/documents/organization/38792.pdf> (emphasis added). Claimants further note, however, that on October 1, 2004, in an attempt to cooperate with Mexico and facilitate settlement of this dispute, Claimants did send Mexico the completed forms that it requested.

- Mexico also states that:

[E]very investor claimant ~~must~~ include with their Notice of Intent other documents including, as the case may be, proof of nationality or articles of incorporation or organization in conformity with the law of a Party; proof that the investor holds the property ~~in~~ direct or indirect control of the investment (for example, the property title) made in the territory of the Party against whom the former seeks to file a claim; and, in the event that the investor claimant acts through a legal representative, copy of the corresponding powers of attorney. Moreover, each investor-claimant must indicate, individually, the relief sought and the amount of damages claimed.

Letter from Mexico, ¶ 25 (emphasis added). Mexico cites no legal authority to support its assertions that these documents must be submitted, other than the Statement. Neither the Statement nor NAFTA contains any of the above requirements. The only law with which Claimants are required to comply in order to satisfy the form for the Notice of Intent is Article 1119 of NAFTA. Article 1119 reads:

Article 1119: Notice of Intent to Submit a Claim to Arbitration

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The disputing investor shall deliver to the disputing Party written notice of its intention to submit a claim to arbitration at least 90 days before the claim is submitted, which notice shall specify:

- (a) the name and address of the disputing investor and, where a claim is made under Article 1117, the name and address of the enterprise;
- (b) the provisions of [NAFTA] alleged to have been breached and any other relevant provisions;
- (c) the issues and the factual basis for the claim; and
- (d) the relief sought and the approximate amount of damages claimed.

Claimants' Notice of Intent and attached Exhibit, dated August 27, 2004 and submitted with the Request for Arbitration, complied with Article 1119.

Moreover, to the extent that Mexico may have had legitimate concerns about the identity of the persons bringing a claim against it and our authority to represent them, those concerns should be obviated by our compliance with the ICSID filing requirements. See, e.g., ICSID Arbitration (Additional Facility) Rules art. 26.

* Mexico makes numerous additional claims that the documents Claimants submitted are insufficient to meet the requirements of NAFTA. For example, Mexico contests the legibility of certain Claimants' articles of incorporation (Letter from Mexico, ¶ 29 n.18, ¶ 31), the validity of certain Claimants' driver's licenses to prove nationality (*id.* ¶ 30), the authorization of Claimants' attorneys to represent them (*id.* ¶ 32), the capacity of the irrigation district Claimants' boards of directors to act on behalf of the Claimants (*id.* ¶ 33), the presence of one Claimant's middle initial in one document and its absence elsewhere, giving rise to the possibility that more than one individual may own a given number of water rights (*id.* ¶ 33), that the irrigation districts represent users who have not been identified (*id.* ¶ 34), and that some certificates of adjudication are not consistent with the Request for Arbitration (*id.* ¶ 35). Many of these claims, such as the authorization of Claimants' attorneys, have already been addressed. It bears repeating that those documents are not required under Article 1119 of NAFTA. Rather, in order to facilitate review of these claims, Claimants did provide Mexico with this documentation in an effort to comply promptly and in good faith with Mexico's requests during the 90-day Notice period. Mexico's continued insistence that Claimants have not produced proper documentation calls into question Mexico's good faith.

2. Issues That Are Merits-Based and Should Be Resolved by the Arbitration Panel

Mexico claims that this dispute is not directly based on an investment or transaction within the state of Mexico. Letter from Mexico, ¶¶ 5-8. As Claimants pointed out in their Notice of Intent and their Request for Arbitration, this dispute is directly based on investments within the State of Mexico: the water rights owned by

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Claimants. Mexico asserts that "this recognition [of water rights as property] originates in United States law and obviously only has effect in the United States." *Id.* ¶ 13.

Contrary to Mexico's assertion, an individual's right to withdraw a certain annual amount of water from a given source is recognized both under Mexican and under international law. Under Mexican law, water may both be privately owned and appropriated by private persons. *Jose Ramon Cossin Diaz, Constitutional Framework for Water Regulation in Mexico*, 35 Nat. Resources J. 489, 490-91 (1995).

The individual's right to water is also recognized under international law. See, e.g., Link B. Blumel, *Comment, The Implications of Formulating a Human Right to Water*, 31 Ecology L.Q. 957 (2004). See also Int'l Conf. on Water and the Env't Dev. Issues for the 21st Century, The Dublin Statement on Water and Sustainable Dev't, princ. 4, in United Nations, Gen. Assembly, Preparatory Comm. for the United Nations Conf. on Env't and Dev., *Preparations for the United Nations Conf. on Env't and Dev. on the Basis of Gen. Assembly Resolution 44/228 and Taking into Account Other Relevant Assembly Resolutions: Recent Actions of Intergovernmental and Other Bodies of Relevance to the Preparatory Process, Protection of the Quality and Supply of Freshwater Resources: Application of Integrated Approaches to the Dev., Mgmt. and Use of Water Resources*, U.N. Doc. A/CONF.151/PC/112 (1992) ("Past failure to recognize the economic value of water has led to wasteful and environmentally damaging uses of the resource. Managing water as an economic good is an important way of achieving efficient and equitable use, and of encouraging conservation and protection of water resources."); Recommendation (2001) 14 of the Committee of Ministers to Member States on the European Charter on Water Resources, para. 11, available at <https://wem.coe.int/ViewDoc.jsp?id=231615&Lang=en> ("It is only fair that, as a counterpart to their rights and entitlements to water, natural and legal persons and institutions, whether in the public sector or the private sector, should contribute to the protection of the water environment and the conservation of water resources."); Int'l Law Ass'n, *The [Revised] International Law Association Rules on the Equitable and Sustainable Use of Waters*, Ninth Draft, art. 4(5) ("States shall not interfere with the right of access to water of persons who reside in another State.") & omt. (finding substantial and increasing support for the recognition of a right to water in numerous international instruments), at 28 (2003), at <http://www.ila-hq.org/pdf/Water%20Resources/Draft%20Rules9November2003.pdf>.

The international recognition of water as an economic good, to which individual entities may claim a right, confirms that Claimants' Request for Arbitration should be registered for review by an arbitration panel.

Mexico also claims that NAFTA is not a proper vehicle for this dispute because of the 1944 Water Treaty. Mexico alleges that disputes under the 1944 Treaty are to be settled under the International Boundary and Water Commission and that the treaty does not set out rights for the benefit of private individuals. Letter from Mexico, ¶¶ 21-22. This assertion is patently without merit. Claimants are not bringing a claim under the 1944 Treaty. The 1944 Treaty simply fixes water deliveries and water allocations



between the United States and Mexico, in the same way that a treaty allocating land between two countries fixes a boundary between those countries. Claimants' Request for Arbitration is based on violations of NAFTA, not of the 1944 Treaty.

Finally, Mexico alleges that Claimants' possession of Certificates of Adjudication issued by the State of Texas shows that Claimants lack an investment in Mexican territory. *Id.* ¶ 36. Claimants vigorously contest this allegation. NAFTA does not require that Chapter 11 claimants possess property titles issued by the Respondent state in order to meet the definition of investment. All that NAFTA requires in this regard is that the investment in question be affected by "measures adopted or maintained by a Party relating to . . . investments of investors of another Party in the territory of the Party." NAFTA art. 1101(1)(b). In our letter of March 7, 2005, we explained why the investment in this case meets the requirements of NAFTA art. 1101. Letter of March 7, 2005, p. 5-7.

We hope that this addresses all of your concerns and that you will now register these claims for arbitration. If you wish to discuss this further, please let me know.

Dear Sr. Ramírez:

This letter responds to your letter of September 9, 2004, requesting certain documents to assist you in evaluating our clients' claim. Enclosed you will find the documents you requested:

1. A copy of Certifications of Representation, confirming our authority to act as attorneys for each of the claimants;
2. A copy of Articles of Incorporation or other documentation for each claimant that is not a natural person, demonstrating that each is an enterprise of the United States;
3. A copy of a driver's license for each claimant who is a natural person, demonstrating that each is a national of the United States;
4. A copy of Certificates of Adjudication and Supplementary Amendments for each relevant water right, certified by the State of Texas, as set forth in Exhibit A of the August 27, 2004 Notice of Intent.
5. Forms signed by each claimant, providing the information you requested. (For additional information on the nature of the investment and amount of the claim, please refer to our August 27, 2004 Notice of Intent.)

We trust that, now that you have been provided with all of the documentation and information you requested, you find yourself in a position to respond to the merits of our clients' claim. We reiterate what we said in our letter to you of August 27, 2004:

As you know, NAFTA encourages the parties to meet and confer in an effort to amicably resolve their dispute, an effort which we heartily endorse. NAFTA, ch. 11, art. 1118 ("The disputing parties should first attempt to settle a claim through consultation or negotiation."). Accordingly, by this letter we request the opportunity to meet at your earliest convenience to initiate discussions in a good-faith effort to resolve this matter prior to initiation of the formal arbitration process. At that time we will be prepared to present our case in greater detail, and to discuss appropriate settlement options; we would ask you to be similarly prepared so as to maximize the likelihood of settlement. Arrangements for the time and place of our settlement discussions should be made through this office.

Finally, we wish to underscore that our August 27, 2004 Notice of Intent provides all of the information required by NAFTA and, accordingly, the 90-day clock is ticking. We have provided all of the enclosed documentation and information (at considerable expense and trouble for our clients) to you as a courtesy, in an effort to facilitate any discussions you may wish to have prior to the initiation of arbitration. However, we must remind you of our clients' position, set forth in our August 27 letter to you, that:

Should our settlement negotiations fail, however, we are prepared to move forward with arbitration at the conclusion of the 90-day period prescribed by NAFTA, by which we will seek a prompt and just resolution of this claim.

We look forward to your prompt response.¹
