Mexico and Denmark: healthy, safe and competitive pork breeding

Both countries operate a project to boost the chain value and strengthen prevention actions against African swine fever.



The Senasica and the Danish government operate a Sectorial Strategic Cooperation Project (PCES) that strengthens the pork production chain value and helps to improve meat control diagnosis and updating.

Denmark is one of the top pork producers in the European Union with 28 million heads of live cattle, almost five times the size of their estimated population of six million people.

Likewise, Mexico is recognized by its pork breeding tradition and high sanitary standards, which has contributed to a 5.7% growth this past year.

A Danish delegation visited our country, as the first step of the project, to get acquainted with the actions implemented by the Senasica to prevent the introduction of African swine fever; It was agreed that this coming April Mexican technicians will visit Denmark to get acquainted with the prevention measures implemented by the European country against the disease.

The European delegation recognized Mexico's technical capacity and the high level of preparation to prevent the introduction of African swine fever, and specifically praised the non-intrusive inspection methods carried out with paired canine teams and will seek Senasica's advice to copy the model at Copenhagen's airport.
