

Export of agricultural products

These activities are based on the Federal Plant Health Law

For vegetable-derived products export activities, Mexico has to meet the phytosanitary requirements based in the worldwide health situation and established by all countries that are party to mutual commercial agreements. Compliance with the phytosanitary standards leads to new market opportunities for Mexican products and positions the country concerning agricultural exports.

The National Service for Agro-Alimentary Public Health, Safety and Quality (SENASICA) is tasked with protecting current international markets through the appropriate phytosanitary certification of export vegetable products and compliance with the requirements established by the National Phytosanitary Protection Organizations (NPPOs).
