The Mexican government supports national coffee farmers to boost the productivity of the sector.



Coffee is one of the most consumed products in the world, for both its delicious flavor and it's health benefits. The grains that are toasted and grinded to prepare the drink come from the seeds of the coffee berry.

Mexico ranks eleventh among the top coffee producers worldwide and produced 860 tons in 2018, which was 3% more than 2017. National coffee farmers earned close to 5,000 million pesos in sales.

Chiapas and Veracruz, which have protected designations of origin, are the top producing states and account for 65.5% of the national production.

Coffee is a valued asset in our country, thus the Secretariats of Agriculture, Welfare and Economy agreed, through the implementation of an interinstitutional commission, to establish a permanent dialogue with the coffee farming sector to seek joint solutions to strengthen productivity, specifically of the coffee farming social sector.
