

If you travel to the European Union

In addition to the Zoosanitary Export Certificate, a European certificate format will be issued, which is valid for 10 calendar days.

Also, consider that to travel to any destination in the European Union, you must present:

- Your plane tickets, reservations, or any document that proves that the pet will travel accompanied, (with its owner or an authorized person, in writing) or that the owner will travel within a period of no more than five days.
- The written statement, under oath to tell the truth, that the trip is not for the sale of the pet or any transfer of ownership. The document must contain the date, full name and signature of the pet owner.
- Document indicating microchip number, date of application or reading. Which must comply with the ISO 11784 standard and apply HDX or FDX-B technology, and be read by a device compatible with the ISO 11785 standard.

Remember, the rabies vaccine must be current. In the case of being the first, the application must be made at least 21 days prior to the trip (the first vaccine is counted as the one that has been applied from 3 months of age and after the application of the identification microchip). In the case of revaccination, it must be applied within the period of validity of the previous one.

Written statement, under oath to tell the truth, that the trip is not for the sale of the pet or any transfer of ownership. The document must contain the date, full name and signature. **[Download the form here!](#)**

Remember, the rabies vaccine must be current. In case it is the first one, it must have been applied at least 21 days prior to the trip (The first vaccination that has been applied after 3 months of age and after the application of the identification microchip is counted as the first vaccine). In case of revaccination, it must have been applied within the period of validity of the previous one.

If you travel to Finland, Ireland, Malta or the United Kingdom

You must present the card or proof of treatment against *Echinococcus multilocularis*, in which you indicate the date and time of application, name of the product, manufacturing laboratory, batch number, expiration date and the administered dose.

The application must be made by a private doctor, for a period no longer than 120 hours but no less than 24 hours prior to the scheduled time of your entry into the European Union.

It can be praziquantel or any other pharmacologically active substance, alone or in combination, which is shown to reduce the number of mature and immature intestinal forms of the parasite in host species.
