## Operation and Supervision of Projects

The Agro-alimentary Health and Safety Program is the main source of funding for the operation of Animal Health Campaigns.

These actions are carried out through the Auxiliary Animal Health Organizations (OASA) authorized by Sader through Senasica.

The Auxiliary Organizations are constituted in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Animal Health Law, its regulations and Senasica procedure 01-050. They operate with federal and state resources based on the provisions of the Coordination Agreement for Sustainable Rural Development, executed by and between the Secretariat of Agriculture and the states; as well as the Specific Technical Annex for the Operation of the corresponding Agro-alimentary Health and Safety Program.

Senasica reviews and validates the Animal Health Campaign programs and coordinates the supervision, follow-up, and evaluation of their correct operation and the use of resources operated by the 31 OASAs in the country.

These actions are included in the Agro-alimentary Health and Safety Program for the Phytozoosanitary Campaigns Component, Subcomponent Control or eradication of regulated animal health pests and diseases, whose work programs include:

- Animal health programs in ruminants
  - o National Campaign against Bovine Tuberculosis.
  - o National Campaign against Brucellosis in animals.
  - National Campaign for the control of Boophilus spp ticks.
  - National Campaign against Rabies in Cattle and livestock species.
- Animal health programs in poultry
  - Avian influenza
- Programs in bees
  - Varroasis of bees
- Program for the elimination of positive, reactor, exposed, and suspect animals.
