Stockbreeders: strategic allies of Senasica

Almost 90 years ago, during the government of General Lázaro Cárdenas del Río, livestock producers held the first National Livestock Convention, which led to the creation of the Livestock Associations Law, published in the Official Gazette of the Federation in 1935.
