

The Senasica is ready to start inspections at the AIFA

The OISA cargo inspection office is fitted with world class technology

With the start of operations of the cargo terminal of the AIFA (Felipe Angeles International Airport), the Secretariat of Agriculture and Rural Development announced itself ready to inspect the vegetable and animal goods that arrive, and thus minimize the risk of introduction of pests and diseases that endanger the production and supply of food in the country.

The Senasica, through the OISA (Office of Agriculture and Livestock Sanitation Inspection), has cutting edge technical and technological resources, and official personnel trained and specialized in inspection matters, which mainly consist of veterinarians-zootechnicians, agronomist engineers, and biologists.

The technicians will carry out their activities at highly specialized spaces, where live animals can be put to quarantine, seized goods can be kept, and biologicals and embryos, dry vegetables, and seeds, among others, can be refrigerated.

In 1,791 square meters, the Office houses 12 sleeping quarters for the dogs of the Senasica's canine units that enhance the inspection processes, a veterinary clinic, a diagnosis laboratory, and a center for processing documents and issuing opinions.
