# RABBIT VIRAL HEMORRHAGIC disease

## HOW IS IT TRANSMITTED?

The virus is found in SECRETIONS and EXCRETIONS of infected animals (ocular and nasal fluid, urine and feces). It can be TRANSMITTED by direct contact or through people, vehicles, material or equipment contaminated with the virus.



#### CLINICAL SIGNS

▶ Occasionally they only manifest terminal

screeches, collapse and sudden death

- Fever
- Depression
- Lack of appetite
- Ocular hemorrhages
- Bloody foamy nasal discharge
- Difficulty breathing
- Excitation
- Incoordination
- Body stiffness
- Death, after 12 to 36 hr at the beginning of the disease
