

Let's continue taking extreme precautions to keep Mexico free of African Swine Fever

On July 28 of this year, **AFRICAN SWINE FEVER** was confirmed in the **Dominican Republic.**

To keep our country free of this devastating disease for pig production, the Secretariat of Agriculture and Rural Development through the Senasica, urges you to follow these preventive actions:

- Increase biosafety measures in your commercial and family production units.
- Apply Good Livestock Practices.
- Ban outsiders from entering the farm.
- Prevent pigs from being fed waste.
- Report immediately to the Senasica, if you detect high mortality of pigs or symptoms such as: fever, lack of appetite, vomiting, nasal discharge, difficulty of breathing, mucous or bloody diarrhea and purple or bruised coloration of the skin, mainly in ears, abdomen and thighs
- Request advice from Senasica to address safety problems in your farms, apply prevention measures and train your personnel, through simulations that are offered virtually to detect dangerous diseases in pigs.
