2021 Fiscal Year

The National Agro-Alimentary Health, Safety and Quality Service (SENASICA) aims to preserve and improve the agro-alimentary health and safety conditions through plant and animal health epidemiological surveillance, inspection of the mobilization of regulated goods, plant, animal, aquaculture, and fishery campaigns, and the operation of contamination risk reduction systems in primary production processes.

Consequently, the SENASICA implements the PSIA (Agroalimentary Health and Safety Program), which is aligned to the Axis no. 3 "Economy", which is a section of the "Food self-sufficiency and countryside recovery" of the 2019-2024 Mexican National Development Plan, and of the Objective no. 1 of the 2020-2024 Sectoral Program of Agriculture and Rural Development: Achieve food self-sufficiency via the increase of agriculture, livestock, aquaculture, and fishery production and productivity, Strategy no. 1.5: Reinforcement of agriculture, livestock, aquaculture and fishery health and safety for the production of healthy and nutritious foods.
