We train mango packagers on health matters

The Senasica and the Cofepris lectured 150 workers from over 70 Mexican companies over an online course.



Training took place from 26-28 of September and was intended for members of companies dedicated to mango packaging and exports

As part of the bilateral cooperation established by the Food Safety Partnership between Mexico and the United States, the health agencies from the Mexican government lectured 150 workers from over 70 mango packaging companies through an online course. Through the course named, "Good hygiene and health practices on plants that treat minimally processed agricultural produce", technicians from the Senasica and the Cofepris explained in detail aspects about contamination risks for agricultural produce, waste management, personnel health and hygiene, sanitary status of fresh foodstuffs, and pest management, among other subjects.

Training took place from 26-28 of September, and was intended for members of companies dedicated to mango packaging and exports in the states of Oaxaca, Chiapas, Mexico City, Guerrero, Michoacán, Colima, Jalisco, Nayarit, Sinaloa, and Nuevo León.

Mexico is the sixth mango producer in the world, hence the importance of the training program that fulfills the commitments agreed upon in the Food Safety Partnership between both countries.
