The Secretariat of Agriculture extends the duration of the National Emergency Device to protect the national poultry farming

The Animal Health National Emergency Device (Dinesa) enables all material and human resources of the Mexican government to be active and strengthen the national poultry farming



To maintain the HPAI control and eradication measures in our national territory, the Secretariat of Agriculture and Rural Development extended the operation of the DINESA for six more months, to help reduce the dissemination risk of the disease, and protect the national poultry farming.

The DINESA extension keeps all material and human resources of the Mexican government active to protect the national poultry farming and reinforce the coordination of the veterinary services throughout the 32 federated states.

The resolution, published in the Federal Official Gazette (DOF), formalizes, and empowers the anti-epidemic measures operated by the National Agro-Alimentary Health, Safety and Quality Service (SENASICA) against the HPAI.

The SENASICA put the DINESA in motion since June 3, 2022, to respond to the highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) outbreak in the Comarca Lagunera region. The emergency operation in this region was finished in early September, after six consecutive weeks with no positive cases detected.

To date roughly more than 1.6 million birds interned in poultry production units (PPUs) in Nuevo León, Sonora, Jalisco, and Yucatán, and in three family farms in Chiapas, Chihuahua, and Estado de México, have been affected. This accounts for 0.08% of the national poultry stocks.

The SENASICA again called all parties that participate in the poultry production chain to promptly report any anomaly they detect in their farms, and reminded them that the winter migration season of waterfowl continues, thus poultry producers must remain on guard because the occurrence of new events in any part of the national territory cannot be discarded.

To report the suspected presence of an animal pest or disease, the SENASICA has made available to the population the 800 751 2100 phone number, and the AVISE application for iOS and Android systems. Reports can be received in any office of the Secretariat of Agriculture, the SENASICA, or the CPA's coordination office, which are located throughout the country.
