We expand Dinesa in defense of national poultry farming

We have strengthened measures for the control and eradication of avian influenza



Pests and diseases are agents that are present in many parts of the world, so each country creates its standards and work strategies to mitigate the risks these threats pose to the animal and public health.

In Mexico we are prepared for any threat of this nature, since we have the National Emergency Animal Health System (Dinesa), which allows to prevent, control and eradicate those exotic and emerging diseases that can put the livestock sector at risk.

In addition, actions established by Dinesa are key to keeping active all the material and human resources available to the Mexican Government to protect the national livestock sector.

The Secretariat of Agriculture and Rural Development extended the operation of Dinesa for six more months, which helps to protect Mexican poultry farming and mitigates the risk of the spread of highly pathogenic avian influenza (IAAP).
