The National Consultative Committee for Agrifood Standardization (CCNNA, by its Spanish acronym), was established at the end of 2012 through an agreement published in the Official Journal of the Federation (DOF, by its Spanish acronym).

Its objective is to reduce the time it takes to prepare, discuss and issue Mexican Official Standards on agrifood matters, in order to strengthen the sector's regulatory framework.

To better perform its functions, the Committee is supported by specialized subcommittees, one of which is the Plant Protection Subcommittee, whose responsibilities include proposing, analyzing and developing preliminary drafts of official Mexican standards for the prevention, control and eradication of plant diseases and pests.

Aln addition, to present those preliminary drafts on contamination risk reduction systems in the primary production of plants; phytosanitary campaigns and quarantines that may be necessary; biological effectiveness of pesticides and plant nutrition inputs; phytosanitary characteristics and specifications to which imports of products of plant origin, their products and by-products will be subject.

These preliminary drafts must be submitted to the National Advisory Committee for Agrifood Standardization for discussion, voting and, if applicable, approval.
