The National Agrifood Health, Safety and Quality Service (Senasica, by its Spanish acronym), aims to preserve and improve sanitary conditions and agrifood safety through phytosanitary epidemiological surveillance, phytosanitary, aquaculture and fishery campaigns and contamination risk reduction systems and good practices in agricultural, livestock, aquaculture and fishery production, and primary processing of aquaculture and fishery products.

Based on the above, Senasica implements the Agrifood Health and Safety Program (PSIA, by its Spanish acronym), which is aligned with Axis 3 "Economy", section on "Food self-sufficiency and rescue of the farmland" of the National Development Plan 2019-2024; as well as the Agriculture and Rural Development Sector Program 2020 -2024, in Objective

1. Achieve food self-sufficiency by increasing agricultural and aquaculture production and productivity, Strategy 1.5 Strengthen agricultural and aquaculture health and safety for the production of healthy and nutritious food.
