You must include the following information:

- 1. Full name, RFC, CURP and address.
- 2. Telephone number with area code
- 3. Contact e-mail address
- 4. Animal species and zootechnical function.
- 5. Country of origin
- 6. Country of departure
- 7. Destination or final use of the merchandise.
- 8. Additional information that you consider may provide technical and documentary support to your request.
- 9. Customs office through which it would enter.



General considerations:

Agriculture-Senasica will carry out a risk analysis and, if applicable, will establish the requirements in an Animal Health Requirements Sheet (HRZ,by its Spanish acronym).

You must cover the cost of the Animal Health Certificate for Importation (\$3093.00) for terrestrial species and (\$3121.00) for aquatic species, in accordance with the Federal Law on Duties in force). The payment form can be downloaded at e5cinco.

If you are sending any animal checked as cargo, it is important that you verify the requirements with the airline of your choice and consider the need to use the services of a customs broker for its release, prior compliance with non-tariff regulations by Agriculture -Senasica.
